

## Prolog Developer Network

The Prolog® Developer Network (PDN) is a developer-oriented program designed for Meridian customers and technology partners who intend to extend Prolog software solutions on their own. To assist in development efforts, this subscription-based network provides the following in the form of Web access to shared knowledge, tools and technology resources from peer developer program subscribers and Meridian's Technical Services.

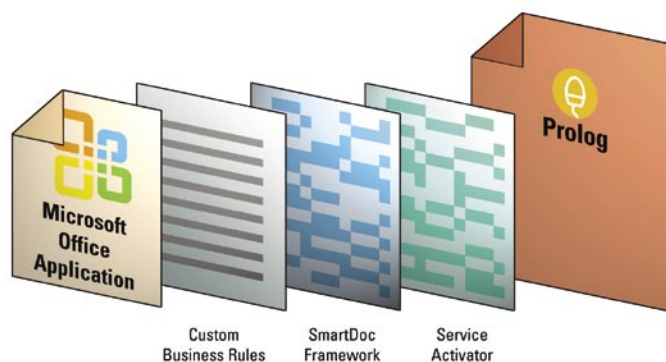
### Core Software Libraries

Access and leverage the Meridian Service Activator, a library of core software used when creating integrated applications, including:

- › Creation of .NET types for each of the XML Schema Definition ( XSD) entities
- › Creation of .NET proxy classes for each of the Web Services Definition Language (WSDL) services
- › Management of Web Services Enhancements (WSE) wrappers around security/addressing

### Office Business Application Framework

Make use of framework tools used for developing Office Business Applications (OBAs). OBAs are customized Microsoft Office documents that are programmed to act as an alternate interface to Prolog's general purpose user interface. This role-based approach allows end users to use familiar solutions, such as Excel, Word, and Outlook, to interact with the system.



The SmartDoc Framework and Service Activator components allow you to build OBAs for Microsoft Office Applications such as Excel, Word and Outlook.

## Knowledge Sharing with Peers

Subscribing to the PDN community gives you access to the Developer Network Knowledge Base where you can leverage the findings of and exchange information with other subscribers. You will also be invited to attend semi-annual technology events developed to provide subscribers with collaborative sessions for discussion and sharing Prolog extensibility techniques.

## Catalog of Development Patterns

Greatly increase the efficiency, effectiveness and rate of success of your development efforts with access to a catalog of common development patterns created by both your subscriber peers and the Meridian Technical Services team. For example, you can address common integration patterns such as message logging, routing and administration with the Meridian Message Bus adapter code examples available to subscribers (Meridian Message Bus sold separately).

With several code examples to leverage, you can easily reduce costs and save time building integrations and extensions.

## Developer Certification

PDN subscribers have the opportunity to earn an individual, technical certification (Meridian Developer) at no additional cost. A Meridian Developer certification verifies an individual's ability to understand the requirements of distribution as well as develop market solutions leveraging Meridian technology and accepted development strategies. Certification requires completion of an online exam and four development case studies.

## Consulting and Technical Support Services

PDN subscribers will also have the opportunity to periodically request design reviews by peer PDN subscribers and Meridian Technical Services to support development progress and success.
